CUC Board Nominees



Keith Wilkinson, BC Region

Keith grew up on a farm in Alberta, traveled widely, completed a PhD at UBC in interdisciplinary studies, and joined the Unitarian Church of Vancouver (UCV) in 1998. At UCV he has served on a range of committees and on the Board as Treasurer and President.

In his career he worked as a public school teacher in Nunavut, as a private consultant, and as a health care and college administrator in Metro Vancouver until retiring in 2011. He writes poetry as a spiritual practice and served for four years on the CUC poetry chapbook editorial team.

Following the CUC/UUA separation, Keith served as a CUC volunteer service consultant for the BC and Western Regions, providing support in the areas of worship services and ministerial transitions. More recently, he has been active with the CUC Environment Monitoring Group and co- authored a climate change curriculum for the CUC.

Keith would like to help strengthen the role of volunteers in the CUC, develop support strategies for large congregations, and improve ways for including young adults and ethnic communities in CUC congregations.



Jane Ebbern, Western Region

Jane has been a member in Calgary (UCC) since 1998 and has served four years on its board, one of which as president. She has also chaired the Physical Plant Committee for 1.5 years and for the last five years, has been Director of the UCC Fruit Cake Operations – a wonderful fall fundraising and community building event.

For five years she helped the Green Sanctuary Committee write grant proposals to the Alberta Government and was instrumental in getting \$50,000 over these 5 years for environmental programs and improvements. She was a delegate for Calgary at the Thunder Bay

and Toronto AGMs.

Jane has 22 years of corporate marketing and retailing experience plus 8 years in non-profit management. She retired at the end April 2014. In addition to serving on the UCC board, Jane was a board director for a local jazz dance company for 5 years.

Susan Ruttan is a retired newspaper reporter, editor, and columnist living in Edmonton. She worked at the Kingston Whig-Standard, Victoria Times, Winnipeg Tribune, Calgary Herald, and Edmonton Journal before taking early retirement in 2008.

Susan joined the Unitarian Church of Edmonton (UCE) in 2001 and has been very active in the congregation. She has twice been board president and twice board treasurer, a position she currently holds. She does a variety of other things in the congregation, such as handling publicity for the 2014 Western Regional Fall Gathering. She

was the 2012 recipient of the congregation's W.H. Alexander Award, given each year to a member who has done exceptional volunteer service for the church.

Other interests include environmental awareness and women's issues. After retirement in early 2013, Joanne stepped up to become president of the board in Regina.

Ben Robins, Central/Eastern Region

Ben Robins grew up in the Kingston Unitarian Fellowship, and is currently at Emmanuel College in Toronto preparing for UU ministry. He is a member at Toronto First, on the ushering team and the Engage & Connect team. Previously, he was active at the Neighbourhood UU Congregation, as Youth Advisor and service leader.

Most of his relationships with UUs across Canada were developed at weekend Youth Cons, Young Adult events, regional gatherings, and at Unicamp, as well as in giving the occasional sermon. When he was 14, his parents cold-called a UU in St. John's, Newfoundland, who

Bunty McCabe Albert joined the Unitarian Fellowship of PEI in about 1993 and has served as its president, secretary and treasurer each several times over the years. She takes every chance she can get to attend CUC Annual Conferences and Meetings, regional gatherings, and services at other UU congregations so she can meet more UUs, be challenged and invigorated.

She retired as a senior manager in the Public Service of Canada in 2008 where her last post was in the field of information management and access to information and privacy. Since retiring she has been

extremely active in ACT (a community theatre) including a two year term as president and the producer of two Shakespeare plays in a park: Macbeth and Hamlet. Her other passions include photography and travel.
